

## General decree

To prevent the spread of the corona virus in the event of further relaxation of the measures issued on the occasion of the corona pandemic, the following regulations are in place:

### I. General

#### 1. Principles

- As far as possible, all commandments and rules that currently apply in public spaces should also be realized within facilities. Reference is made to the regulation of the State Ministry for Social Affairs and Social Cohesion Saxony as a protection against the coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19 (Corona Protection Regulation - SächsCoronaSchVO) from June 23, 2020.
- Only people without a COVID 19-suspicion are allowed to visit companies, facilities or accept offers.
- The etiquette rules for coughing and sneezing have to be followed and observed.
- In addition to the SächsCoronaSchVO, it is highly recommended to wear a mouth-and-nose cover in closed rooms if the minimum distance of 1.5 meters cannot be kept.
- Distance markings on the floor can be helpful as an orientation. If necessary, the distance regulations should also be pointed out in front of a building.
- Avoid narrow areas and redesign if necessary. Arrangements to direct visitors should be taken.
- Based on the hygienic rules for music schools in section II.4, orchestras, choirs and joint singings should keep a larger minimum distances.
- All the hygiene requirements that apply at the particular location should be presented concisely and clear on information signs / posters, if necessary by using pictograms.
- Precautions must take place to ensure that everyone can wash or disinfect their hands after entering the places mentioned in Section II.
- Frequent hand washing and if necessary disinfection should be preferred to wearing disposable gloves.
- Possibilities for voluntary guests and visitors registration should be provided to facilitate contact tracing.
- Cashless payment is recommended; avoid further interactive actions with additional contacts (key operation, touch screens etc.).
- Used rooms have to be ventilated regularly.
- Outdoor activities and stays outside are preferred over stays and activities in closed rooms.
- A person responsible for the compliance with the hygiene and infection protection requirements must be named.
- Employers have to implement special occupational safety measures based on an updated risk assessment. The SARS-CoV-2 occupational safety standard published by the Federal Ministry of Labor and Social Affairs and, if available, its industry-specific adjustment by the responsible accident insurance institution or the supervisory authority have to be taken into account.
- In the concepts created in accordance to Section 4 (2) of the SächsCoronaSchVO, current existing industry-specific concepts or concepts from professional associations need to be observed.
- In accordance with Section 4 (4) SächsCoronaSchVO, facilities and operators need to approve their concepts by the responsible local authorities.
